Commissioner Benner opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on April 2, 2012 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. Commissioner Rudy was attending a CCAP meeting.

Public Comments: Robert Hench expressed his opinion regarding impact fees for a tax on well drilling sites. Mr. Hench would also like to review the warrant list for the county before being approved at the meeting.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the minutes of March 26, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to sign the warrant list in the amount of \$91,850.79 for the week of April 2, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Lori Lower, C&Y Director, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the contract with United Methodist Home for Independent Living at a cost of \$30.14 per session for children in placement. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the 2012-2013 “Accountability Works Community Service Program” in the amount of \$10,000. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. The term of the Agreement is April 1, 2012 through March 31, 2013. Perry Human Services implements this program on behalf of the county and the juvenile probation office.

Employee Status: None.

Solicitors Report: Nothing that required Action.

Open forum for the Press: Luke Roman asked if the commissioners were in support of amending the Prevailing Wage Act to raise the threshold of \$25,000 to \$183,000 to help save the county money on construction projects. The commissioners are in support of this Act.

Public Comments: Mr. Hench feels the commissioners should pressure our representatives to support the Right to Work Law that was introduced and make PA a right to work state.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 10:25 A.M.
