

**COMMISSIONERS GENERAL SESSION**

Commissioner Benner opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on June 11, 2012 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence.

**Public Comments:** Olive Stoops, President of the Pennsylvania Association of School Retirees presented the Commissioners a mock check in the amount \$539,510 for 25,258 hours of community service for 2011. This is what it would cost the county if these volunteers were paid for the work they do. The school retirees volunteer more than any other group of volunteers.

Annetje Earnest presented the commissioners with the original deed for the court house property. This deed was for 8 acres and showed plans for the jail and courthouse. This deed was in the possession of her mother Carolyn Weston Phillis and will be displayed at the courthouse.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to approve the minutes of June 4, 2012. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to sign the warrant list in the amount of \$105,184.66 for the week of June 11, 2012. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Tom Bell, 911 Director, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the Agreement for Mission Critical Partners for Consulting Services for 911. The cost is \$60,000 for a two year period. Mission Critical Partners, Inc. provides consultative assistance relative to purpose, cost, scope and schedule associated with the County's 911 communications. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion.

Based on the recommendation of Cumberland Perry Drug & Alcohol Commission, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the contracts for inpatient non-hospital-fee-for service for the drug & alcohol treatment-per state wide rate setting process. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Lori Lower, C&Y director, Commissioner Rudy made a motion to approve the following Service Agreements for Children & Youth. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried.

- Bair Foundation- \$53.76-\$80.97/day (no increase)
- Catholic Charities-\$73.74-\$175.06/day (increase of \$3.33 day)
- Concern- \$24.00-\$190.59/day (no increase)
- CSG Chariots-(new contract) \$28.87-\$144.03/day
- Diakon Lutheran Social Ministries- \$53.96-\$203.69/day (increase of \$8.02 for 1 day program)
- Diversified Treatment Alternatives- \$22.50-\$182.98 (no increase)
- Lancaster County Youth Intervention Center-\$170.94-\$280.32/day increase of \$3.88 day
- NHS Human Services of PA \$28.72-\$124.10/day (no increase)
- Outside In School \$82.68-\$248.05/day (no increase)

Commissioner Naylor made the motion that effective September 1, 2012, the County will terminate the financial aspect of the County Recycling Program and hope the local municipalities will continue the recycling program. A meeting will be held at a later date with the County Recycling Coordinator and Vincent Sharar, County Recycler Site Provider. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Employee Status:**

Based on the recommendation of Michele Harris, Aging Director, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to promote Laura Yoder to the position of Aging Care Manager, Supervisor, effective June 12, 2012. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to accept the resignation of Rosanne Smoker, law clerk, effective May 25, 2012. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Solicitors Report:** The Prime Care Prison contract has been tabled until the prison gives its approval. The contract is regarding HIPPA requirements that both the prison and prime care must follow but puts the liability on the county only.

**Public Comments:** None.

Comments from the Press: Noelle Barrett, Perry County Times asked the question of how many municipalities would be impacted from the elimination of the county recycling program and the answer was New Bloomfield, Millerstown, Loysville and Newport.

Commissioner Benner made a motion to go into executive session to discuss employee status.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 10:30 A.M.
