Commissioner Benner opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on March 26, 2012 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. Commissioner Rudy was attending a CCAP conference.

Public Comments: Robert Hench read an article from Lancaster Farming regarding western Maryland fees that were used for impact studies from Marcellus Shale taxes.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the minutes of March 19, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to sign the warrant list in the amount of \$357,418.20 for the week of March 26, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Cumberland-Perry Mental Health/IDD, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the new contract with Aspirations LLC, in the amount of \$39,000. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. This service is for Early Intervention Services for psychological evaluations and behavior support.

Based on the recommendation of the Drug & Alcohol Commission, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the 2012-2013 American Lung Association Contract. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. The term of the Agreement is July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The agreement amount is \$20,000.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to Adopt Ordinance 2012-1, enacting an unconventional gas well fee pursuant to Act 13 of 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. The County of Perry imposes an unconventional gas well fee on each unconventional gas well spud in Perry County, Pennsylvania, as authorized by Title 58. This Ordinance may be amended or repealed at a later date.

Employee Status: Based on the recommendation of Warden Yeingst, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to hire Rosalee A. Andrae, Shermansdale, as a part time cook at the prison, effective March 26, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Warden Yeingst, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to hire Alan Keck, Duncannon, as a part time correctional officer at the prison, effective March 26, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Based on the recommendation of Warden Yeingst, Commissioner Naylor made a motion to hire Michael Gantt, Newport, as a part time correctional officer at the prison, effective March 26, 2012. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Solicitors Report: Solicitor Bunt informed the Board that the Perry County Prison Contract, Local 776, was presented to the Commissioners for signature.

Public Comments: Mr. Hench read the programs that fees would help. Only 15% of the money would go to the counties for planning acquisitions. Mr. Hench feels that this is another tax on our citizens.
