Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the Perry County Intermediate Punishment Grant to cover the cost of an officers salary and supplies and treatment for 2016 through 2018 for a total of \$128,039.60. Commissioner Rudy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to Adopt Resolution 2016-5. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. This Resolution allows the County to apply for costs incurred on behalf of the County due to the snow storm in January.for a total of \$10,414.00

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to Adopt Resolution 2016-6. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. This Resolution supports PCTA to consolidate and cooperate with other transit agencies to reduce direct and overhead expenses, redudce liablility on behalf of transit, continue to maintain or expand current service levels and ensure continued funding levels.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to Adopt Resolution 2016-7. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. This Resolution endorses the Allegheny Ridge Heritage Area. This area runs from Pittsburgh to Harrisburg throughout a 320 mile corridor. Which promotes historical sites and conserves our natural resources.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to Adopt Resolution 2016-8. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. This Resolution is a 1,300 mile symbol of resiliency and character that links the World Trade Center in New York, The Pentagon and Flight 93 Memorial in Shanksville, PA. The County of Perry resides in one of 6 states and the District of Columbia through withich the 911 National Memorial Trail runs.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to approve the contract for Prime Care Medical for psychiatrist services at the Perry County Prison at a cost of \$3,924.49 per month from the period of March 28, 2016

through December 31, 2016. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. Commissioner Naylor abstained.

Commissioner Rudy made a motion to approve a Electrical Maintenance Proposal in the amount of \$4,404.00 for the Perry County Courthouse for a inspection on electrical services and report deficiencies. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Solicitors Report:** Based upon the review of Solicitor Bunt, Commissioner made a motion to approve the 2015/2016 Purchase of Service Agreement for the United Methodist Home for Children for Children & Youth Services in the amount of \$210/day from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. Commissioner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Public Comments:** Sealed bids will be received by the Commissioners Office until May 16, 2016 for the construction of the Rehabilitation of the Dellville Bridge.

Commissioner Naylor received two awards at the C.C.A.P. spring conference on behalf of the County for having the lowest Experience Modification Claims for Workers Compensation Claims for the County for the fourth year in a row. This is due to our active safety committee, employees that are safety conscience and timely reporting of claims. The second award was presented to the Chief Clerk for the 2016 PCOMP loss Control Award for “Outstanding Efforts to Reduce Claims for Perry County”. This savings is passed on to the residents of the County by having lower insurance costs.
