Commissioner Benner opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on September 8, 2014 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. Commissioner Rudy was absent.

Public Comment: None.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the minutes of August 25, 2014. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the warrant list for a total of \$442,105.07 for the week of September 1, 2014 and September 8, 2014. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to Adopt Resolution 2014-11. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried. The Perry County Commissioners declare September 9, 2014 as “Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Awareness Day” and pledge to continue to partner with organizations, health care professionals, educators and the public to raise awareness about “fetal alcohol spectrum disorders” that describes the range of effects that can occur in a baby whose mother drank alcohol during pregnancy.

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve the 2013-2014 Children & Youth contract for Bethany Home in the amount of \$151.50-\$200.00 per day for housing. Commissioner Benner seconded the motion. Motion carried.
