CONIFERS

Concolor (7-14"): Grows to 100 feet. Ashy gray trunk and soft silvery blue foliage. Flat needles are 1½" to 2" long. Excellent for Christmas tree and ornamental use. Best needle retention of short needled trees and has pleasant citrus aroma. Withstands heat and drought better than other firs. Grows best in well drained soils.

Douglas Fir (10-20"): Grows to 60 feet. Short, soft, blue-green needles. Excellent for timber, and good for Christmas tree use due to its color, symmetrical form and needle retention. Prefers moist well drained soils.

Eastern White Pine (10-20"): Fast growing to 100 feet. A five needled pine, with soft, 4 inch light green-blue needles. Makes an excellent ornamental, as well as Christmas or timber tree. Responds well to shearing. Does well in ordinary soils.

Norway Spruce (10-24"): Grows to 75 feet. Shiny, dark green, 1 inch needles on spreading branches with drooping twigs. An extremely hardy tree that is successful under most conditions. Suited for Christmas tree use, as an ornamental or excellent for forming a protective windbreak.

BACKYARD HABITAT ENHANCERS

Buttonbush: A shrub or small tree (grows to 25 feet tall) that gets its name from its fragrant ball like cluster of white flowers which bloom May-August. A good source of nectar for butterflies and seeds for ducks and deer. Does best in moist soils.

Black Chokeberry: Multi-stemmed shrub that grows 3 to 5 feet in height and width. In spring, white flowers form 3 inch clusters. Fruit is a shiny, blackish purple berry that songbirds and upland birds eat. Leaves are glossy dark green turning wine-red color in the fall. Prefers sun.

White Flowering Dogwood: Grows to 40 feet. Dense green foliage, turning bright scarlet in fall. Clusters of large white flowers bloom in May. Produces bright red berries in the fall which are a food source for birds, squirrels and other animals. Grows well in average well drained soil.

Red Maple: Grows to 60-70 feet tall. Bright red flowers occur in clusters in early spring. Leaves turn to shades of red, orange and yellow in the fall. Grows well in a variety of conditions and is commonly planted as an ornamental. The seeds provide food for squirrels and some birds.

Black Gum: Grows to 70 feet. Lustrous green leaves turn bright scarlet in the fall to contrast with bright blue small fruit. Typically has a straight trunk with reddish brown bark. Grows well in variety of conditions. Fruit is relished by many mammals and more than 30 species of birds.

Tree Shelter (24" or 48"): A blue plastic sheet that is placed in a plastic sleeve to form a 24" or 48" inch tall tube. Protects seedlings from wildlife damage. Increases survival rate and growth. Not recommended for evergreens. Requires a stake.

Northeast Perennial and Annual Wildflower Mix: This is a beautiful all-purpose wildflower mix, containing about 1/3 annual wildflowers for first year color, and 2/3 perennials for color the following years. This is a mix of native and naturalized species. Seed at 1 oz/125 sq. ft., 8oz/1,000 sq. ft in sunny location.

Bluebird Box: Feature an overhang roof, bottom slots for drainage, recessed bottom to prevent rain seepage, and an easy open front for monitoring and cleaning. Attach boxes 4 to 6 feet high on a post facing the nearest tree or shrub, and space boxes at least 100 yards apart. Boxes are made by West Perry FFA students.

Orders are subject to availability. All seedlings must be purchased by placing a prepaid order. If any one species is sold out, the District will refund payment for those seedlings not available. All seedlings sold are bare root and their survival rate varies from site to site, from excellent to poor. We strive to provide the most viable seedlings available, and all efforts are made to handle seedlings in a manner that prevents root stress. The Perry Conservation District will not insure successful plantings of bare root seedlings, just as our suppliers will not insure seedling survival. The District is not responsible for orders not picked up by 6:00 pm on April 7, 2011.
